## **“MOOSE KIDSTALKS” Instructions**

“Moose Kids-Talks” presentations are created and developed by high school students after attending the Association Student Congress. The subject matter is not limited to drugs and alcohol. Because there are many adverse elements in local communities, students decide on a subject that is prevalent in his/hers area. Collect as much information as possible on your subject, by using websites on the computer, your local library etc. Then use your information and create it for younger minds, so that they can understand what you are trying to tell them. Presentations should be delivered in a positive manner to encourage the young children in the audience to choose a healthy lifestyle and to make wise decisions. Your certificate is proof that you completed the congress and you are now a “Kids-Talk” presenter, provide your when contacting for a Kids-Talk presentation.

The “Moose Kids-Talks” are presented to groups of children, whose ages range from 4-9 years old. There are many possibilities to choose from: *Pre-Schools, After School Day Cares, Elementary Schools, Head Start program, Sunday School Classes, Children of Lodge/Chapter Members, Scouting Units, Neighborhood Groups, Youth Sports Leagues, YMCA?YWCA, 4-H Clubs, Boy’s and Girl’s Clubs, Local Community Centers, Big Brother/Big Sisters, etc.*

After each presentation, the student prepares a “moose Kids-Talks” report form (each student received a form, you need to make blank copies). Each presentation is different from the other, something happens or certain question is asked by a youngster. You need to report on things like that. Write a report on how you got all your information, the props you used or made for your presentation. “Do not complete one form and make copies for the rest, this will disqualify you for the ISC.” The student then mails the completed form to the Association Coordinator (make copies for you) and gives a copy to the Lodge/Chapter Coordinator (make copies for yourself). It is the student’s responsibility to see that this is completed. The Lodge/Chapter Coordinator should work together to make sure that the students complete the “Kids-Talks” challenge by doing a minimum of three presentations and submitting the report forms. In order to be eligible for selection by their peers to attend the International Student Congress, a student must complete and file a **minimum** of three or more “Moose Kids-Talks” reports with the Association Coordinator.

The “Moose Kids-Talks” report form will be the sole basis for the International Student Congress selection process. Therefore, the report form must be completed in a timely manner, (deadline by Feb, 28<sup>th</sup>) with full-detailed explanations of the presentations. Do not do Kids-Talks together; Individual Presentations. After sending your forms by mail send me an e-mail to confirm that I received your Kids-Talk forms.

## **Qualifications for attendance to the International Student Congress.**

Attendee selection is based upon the completion of a minimum of 3 Kids-Talk presentations. These presentations should be scheduled following your Association Student Congress and continue through February 28, 2012. Each student that attends the Association Student Congress will be provided the same opportunity to be selected to attend the 2012 International Student Congress.

**The 2012 International Student Congress will be held in White Plains, New York April 26 – 30, 2012.** It will be hosted by the New York Moose Association. There will be five scholarships awarded at the International Student Congress - \$12,000.00, \$8,000.00, \$5,000.00, \$3,000.00 and \$2,000.00. **ONLY the \$12,000 scholarship winner will be invited to attend our International Convention in Tampa, Florida during July 2012.**

PMA Scholarships- 1<sup>st</sup> place winner to the ISC gets a \$1000.00 scholarship  
2<sup>nd</sup> place winner to the ISC gets a \$500.00 scholarship

### **Selection of International Student Congress attendees.**

I then contact a local youth group through a local school system, and I have those students review the reports of the individuals and select the Association 2012 International Student Congress attendee(s). **The bottom line is the International Student Congress attendee(s) are selected by their peers.**
